Should I get a COVID-19 booster? Source: CDC & WebMD

- Yes, you should get a COVID-19 booster when you become eligible to receive the best protection against COVID-19, especially with the new variant Omicron. Studies show after getting vaccinated against COVID-19, protection against the virus and the ability to prevent infection with variants may decrease over time and due to changes in variants.
- The number one goal for COVID-19 vaccines is to protect against severe illness and death. Your protection against COVID-19 greatly increases if you follow the recommended schedule for the booster.
- Data from clinical trials showed that a booster shot increases antibodies to improve protection against getting infected with COVID-19. Higher antibody levels from vaccines makes the average person less likely to get sick from COVID-19. The booster provides even greater protection against severe disease and death.

When should I get a booster?

- **Pfizer** If you received the Pfizer vaccine for your first two doses of the series, it is recommended that you get a booster 5 months after your second dose for those 16 and older.
- Moderna If you received the Moderna vaccine for your first two doses, it is recommended that you get a booster 6 months after your second dose.
- Johnson & Johnson If you received the Johnson & Johnson vaccine, you should get a booster 2 months after receiving your only dose. It is now recommended that you receive a mRNA vaccine (Pfizer or Moderna) for your booster dose. Booster shots of mRNA vaccines increase antibodies by about 10 times.
- Mix & Match: You may choose any type of COVID-19 vaccine for your booster dose, but mRNA vaccines (Moderna or Pfizer) are recommended, with the exception of adolescents ages 16-17 who are only eligible for Pfizer.
