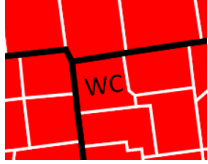

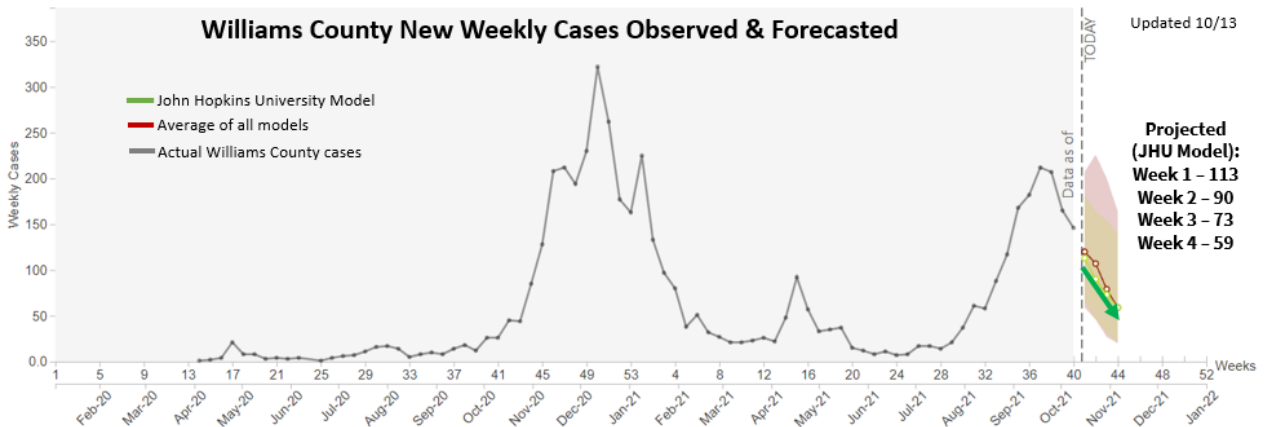

- **The John Hopkins University Forecast has been the model that most accurately predicts the weekly cases Williams County will have for the next four weeks. The forecast was updated on October 13th and predicts that Williams County will have a decrease in the number of weekly cases, with 59 cases projected the week of November 1st.**

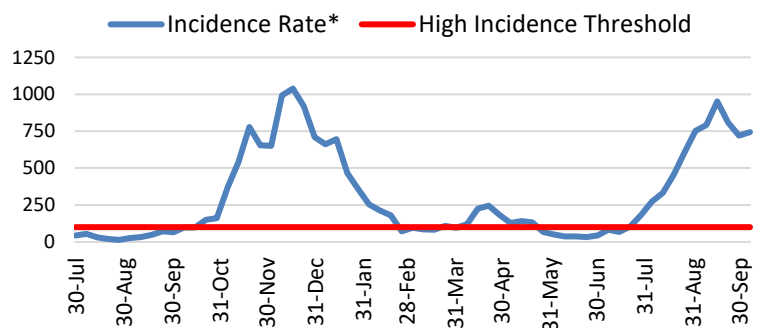
- While the number of cases is expected to decrease, it is important to continue to take precautions to protect yourself and others from COVID-19.



The COVID-19 case and death surveillance data reported by jurisdictions to CDC are subject to change. These data, featured on COVID Data Tracker and within Data.CDC.gov datasets, may be incomplete for recent days due to processing and reporting delays. All data are provisional.

- Williams County has been experiencing high community transmission which means that there is increased spread of COVID-19. With the decline in cases per week, we get closer to falling below high incidence (100 cases per 100,000 population in 2 weeks, or 36 cases in 2 weeks in Williams County).
- Williams County needs to work together to decrease the spread of COVID-19 in our community. Get a COVID-19 vaccine, wear a mask, and social distance.
