

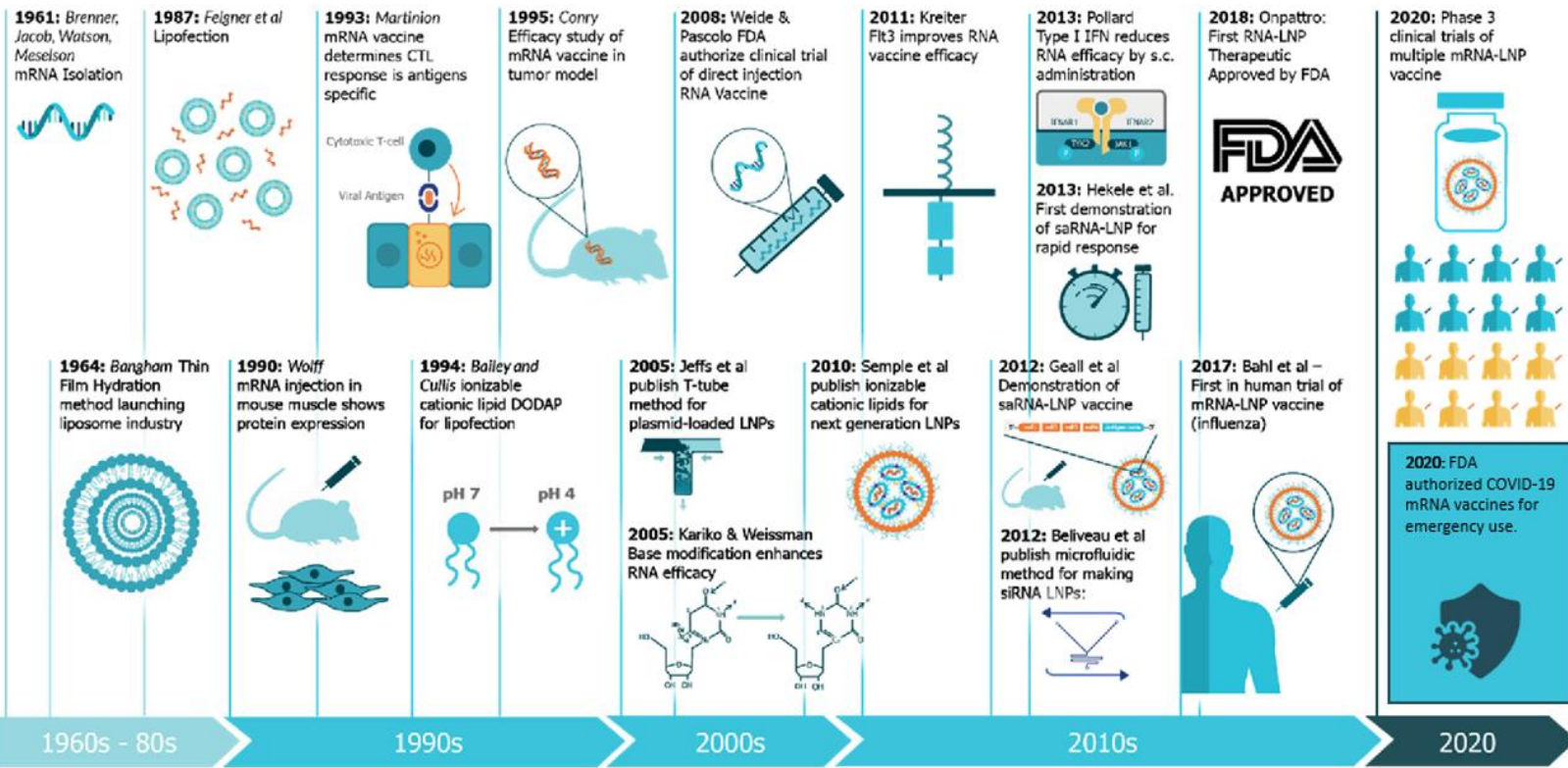

 - Pfizer and Moderna vaccines are messenger RNA (mRNA) vaccines.
 - These vaccines were developed based on decades of scientific research. mRNA was discovered in the early 1960s. After, researchers have been taking small steps to progress the technology necessary to develop a safe and effective mRNA vaccine.
