Community Talking Points

May 19, 2021

- In the past 7 days (May 11th-May 18th), there have been 36 new cases, 0 hospitalizations, and 2 deaths reported. As of 5/13, Williams County remains level 2 (orange) on the Ohio Public Health Advisory System (OPHAS) and triggered 2 of the 7 indicators (New cases per capita & Non-congregate cases) and high incidence.
- **The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention has updated the recommendations for fully vaccinated people. Masks and social distancing are no longer recommended for those who are fully vaccinated, unless it is required by federal, state, local, tribal, or territorial laws, rules, and regulations, including local business and workplace guidance.  - To be considered fully vaccinated, 2 weeks must pass after an individual completes the COVID-19 vaccination series (1 dose of Johnson & Johnson, 2 doses of Moderna, or 2 doses of Pfizer).
 - Fully vaccinated people can:
 - Resume activities without wearing masks or physically distancing, except where required by federal, state, or local laws, rules and regulations, including local business and workplace guidance
 - Resume domestic travel and refrain from testing before or after travel or self-quarantine after travel
 - Refrain from testing before leaving the United States for international travel (unless required by the destination) and refrain from self-quarantine after arriving back in the United States
 - Refrain from testing following a known exposure, if asymptomatic (some exceptions apply)
 - Refrain from quarantine following a known exposure if asymptomatic
 - Refrain from routine screening testing if feasible
 - **These changes were made because the authorized COVID-19 vaccines are highly effective at protecting vaccinated people against symptomatic and severe COVID-19. A growing body of evidence also suggests that fully vaccinated people are less likely to transmit the virus to others.**
- **In Ohio, most health orders will be lifted on June 2nd.** This timeline will allow anyone who has not yet received a COVID-19 vaccine to obtain one to protect themselves before the protective measures are lifted. Until then, Ohio is amending the mask mandate to align with the CDC's recommendations for fully vaccinated people. After June 2nd, it is up to individuals, schools, & businesses to determine if masks should be worn. This change will not prevent a business from imposing its own requirements. Masks are strongly recommended for unvaccinated people. With variants being more contagious, the virus is more dangerous for those who have not received the COVID-19 vaccine.
- Getting the COVID-19 vaccine can be convenient! Free vaccine clinics are being held at the following locations:
 - **Saturday, May 22nd at the Bryan Spring Fling** – The WCHD and Bryan Area Chamber of Commerce are partnering to provide a COVID-19 Pfizer and Johnson & Johnson Vaccine Clinic during the Spring Fling Event in Bryan. Vaccines will be available from 10am to 3pm at the Chamber of Commerce Office on the square. Pre-register by calling 419-485-3141 or visit bit.ly/WCVaccine. Walk-ins are welcome.
 - **Thursday, June 3rd Edgerton Clinic:** The WCHD is partnering with HPWO to host a clinic in Edgerton at the Edgerton Town Hall (324 N. Michigan St.) on June 3rd at 2pm - 4pm. Pfizer, Johnson & Johnson, and Moderna vaccines will be available. Pre-register by calling 567-239-4562 then click 1; walk-ins also accepted.
 - **Montpelier WCHD Clinics:** Pfizer clinics take place on Mondays, Tuesdays, and Thursdays, and Johnson and Johnson clinics take place on Fridays. Times and dates are added as more vaccine becomes available. Check back for more times if appointments become full. Register online (bit.ly/WCVaccine), by phone (419-485-3141), or by texting "VAX" to 419-630-3731. **Walk-in appointments are also accepted during clinic hours.**
