

• Williams County is projected to have a continual increase in new COVID-19 cases in the next four weeks. The John Hopkins University model can be used to predict the number of new cases that Williams County will have each week for the next four weeks. Historically, it has been the model that generates the most accurate forecast for our area. The chart below shows the actual weekly cases (grey line) and projected weekly cases (green line).



- The forecast projects that Williams County will have 179 new cases in the first week, 206 new cases in the second week, 231 new cases in the third week, and 242 new cases in the fourth week (end of September).
- The graph was updated on Sept. 8th, one week ago, which means that we can compare the accuracy of the prediction with our current data. So far, the forecast is conservative, showing fewer cases than we have seen in the first week (179 cases projected versus 198 actual cases in the past 7 days).
- The CDC recommends that everyone should wear a mask indoors, regardless of vaccination status, in areas of substantial (orange) or high (red) transmission of COVID-19. Williams County is currently red based on our high community transmission.  - COVID-19 vaccines continue to offer the best protection against COVID-19; however, other precautions like wearing a mask and social distancing can be used to lower your risk of infection or risk of spreading

the virus to others. While vaccines reduce severe illness and death from COVID-19, the surge of COVID-19 cases calls for additional precautions to be taken in our community.

- Masks are effective to reduce the transmission of COVID-19 in communities. Wearing a mask helps stop the spread of COVID-19 by preventing you from breathing in droplets from those around you, which helps to reduce the risk of getting infected. It also helps protect others by catching droplets that you breathe out that could spread the virus if you are sick (even if you don't know you are sick). This protects unvaccinated individuals and those who are vulnerable to COVID-19 in our community.
