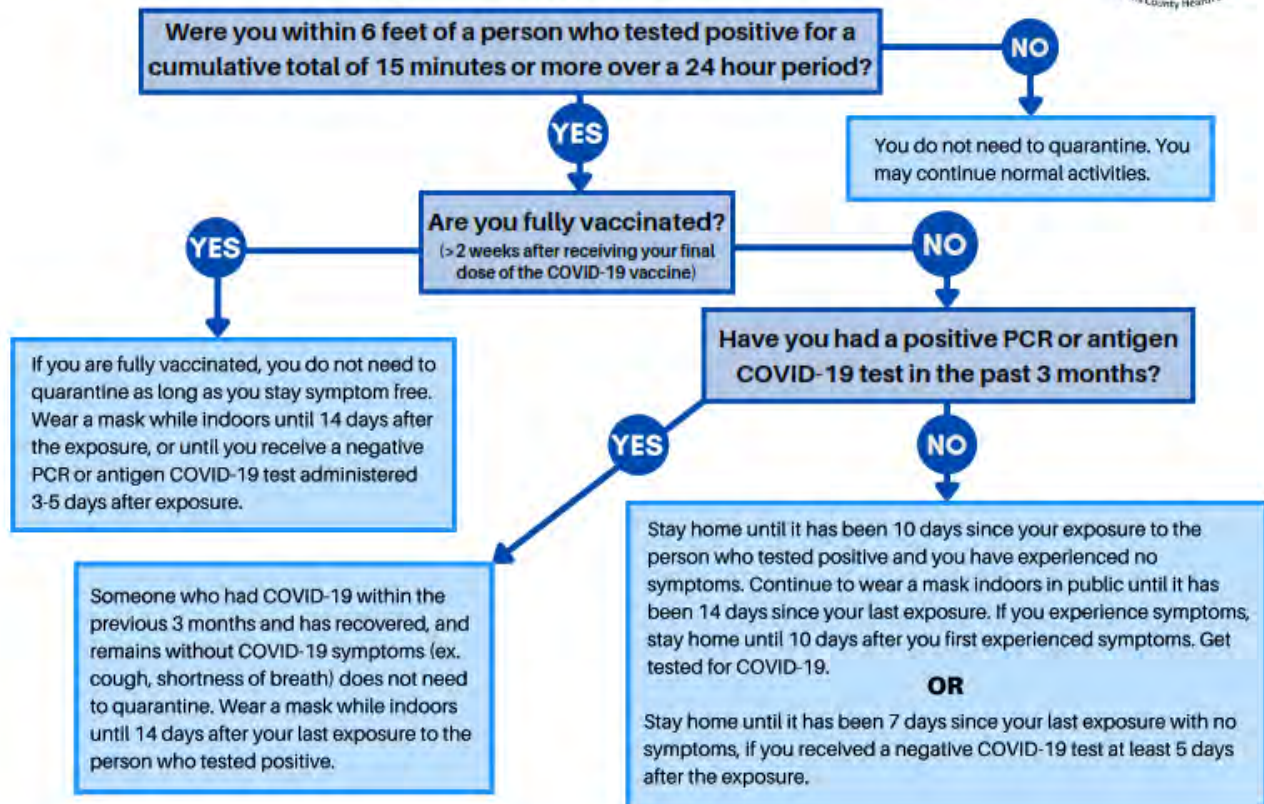

- Williams County is experiencing an increase in COVID-19 cases. If you test positive for COVID-19, follow the guidelines on the attached page to keep others safe. If you were exposed to a COVID-19 case, follow the guidance in the flowchart below.

## Quarantine Guidelines After Exposure to a COVID-19 Case

This chart can be used to help guide quarantine decisions for someone exposed to COVID-19.

# DO I NEED TO ISOLATE OR QUARANTINE?

If you are a positive case or have been exposed to a COVID-19 case, it is extremely important to follow these guidelines.

## COVID-19 Positive



If you have tested positive for COVID-19, stay home and separate yourself from others. You can end isolation by meeting **ALL** of the following requirements.

### If you have symptoms:

1. It has been at least 10 days since symptoms first appeared.
2. It has been at least 24 hours since your last fever and you have not used fever-reducing medications.
3. Your symptoms have improved.

### If you show no symptoms:

1. 10 days have passed since your positive test was taken.

## COVID-19 Close Contact

You are considered a close contact to a COVID-19 case if you have been within 6 feet of the case for a cumulative total of 15 minutes or more in a 24-hour period.

**If you are unvaccinated and have not had a positive PCR or antigen COVID-19 test in the past 3 months and have been exposed to a COVID-19 case, you need to stay home until you meet one of the following requirements.**

- It has been 10 days since your last exposure and you are not experiencing symptoms. Continue to wear a mask indoors in public until it has been 14 days since your exposure.
- It has been 7 days since your last exposure, and you received a negative COVID-19 test result from a test taken at least 5 days after the exposure and you have no symptoms.

**Anyone who was exposed to someone with COVID-19 and meets the following criteria does NOT need to stay home.**

- Someone who has been fully vaccinated and shows no symptoms of COVID-19. Fully vaccinated individuals should get tested 3-5 days after their exposure, even if they don't have symptoms, and wear a mask indoors in public for 14 days following exposure or until their test is negative.
- Someone who had COVID-19 within the previous 3 months and has recovered, and remains without COVID-19 symptoms (ex. cough, shortness of breath).

## REMINDERS:

It is critical to identify who has been close to a case to limit the spread of the virus & keep the community safe.

If you test positive, create a list of people (& contact info) who have been close to you starting 2 days before you had symptoms until now or 2 days before you tested positive if you have no symptoms.

Inform those on your contact list that you have tested positive for COVID-19 so they can begin to quarantine if unvaccinated.

Contact your health care provider and seek care if needed.
