These clinics are an excellent opportunity to ensure your child is up-to-date on their vaccinations, protecting them and their fellow classmates from preventable diseases.

Clinics are available every Tuesday at the Montpelier office from 9am-4:15pm and on Thursdays from 9:30am-4pm. This year, WCHD is extending our clinic hours on the first Tuesday in August (1st) and September (5th) to better accommodate schedules.

WCHD Program Highlight: Food Protection

The WCHD annually performs over 650 inspections of places that serve food to the public. Some examples include grocery stores, carry outs, restaurants, mobile food operations at fairs and festivals and temporary events.



What is the purpose of an inspection?

Inspections are conducted to make sure that safety is being followed in the handling, cleaning and preparation of food that is sold to the public. It is also an opportunity to work with owners/managers to educate and answer any questions they have about ensuring safe food is served to the public.



What is checked during an inspection?

- Making sure food is held at the correct temperature. Food not being held below 40 degrees Fahrenheit in refrigerators or not being held at or above 135 degrees Fahrenheit can result in people becoming ill.
- Making sure employees are washing their hands. Example: after using the restroom or cleaning tables and then handling food.
- Making sure facilities are in good repair, and free from vermin such as mice and insects.



What happens when problems are found?

First and foremost, we work with the operator to explain violations and work with them to correct those violations. If it is an immediate unsafe situation, such as improper temperature, the food is disposed of to prevent it being served to the public. If it is a cleaning situation or a repair to equipment or the building, a timeframe is given for when a follow-up inspection will occur.



Are inspections announced?

No, except for follow-up inspections, they are not announced or scheduled.



What does WCHD do when a food business is not up to code?

WCHD has a procedure that is followed to help food businesses correct violations and serve safe food to their customers. The focus is on education to help the staff understand the reasons why the violations are important to food safety. In some cases, meetings are held with the owner or manager to talk about ways they can prevent the same violations on future inspections.


